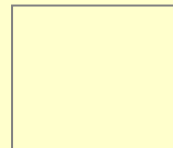

Clear, brown or green bottles, jugs or jars, drinking glasses. Must be clean with cap removed.



Corrugated boxes (flattened), & paper board such as cereal & tissue boxes.

⊘ NO food contaminated boxes such as pizza boxes and no 'freezer' boxes.



Numbers 1 through 7 --must be clean with tops removed.

- look for recycling triangle on bottom of container- number is inside triangle

- ⊘ NO Plastic bags
- ⊘ NO Baby diapers
- ⊘ NO Oil containers
- ⊘ NO Silage wrap



All junk mail, brochures, magazines, newspapers, anything delivered in a Sunday paper, any colored bond paper, manila file folders, adding machine paper, envelopes, copy or fax paper.



Clean aluminum cans, Tin or Steel cans, dried empty paint cans (lid removed), empty aerosol cans, and small pieces of scrap metal.
