TOUR 1: Wolf Lake Town Hall: 9:30-11:30

- A. City of Wolf Lake— New septic system for city, treating for invasive plant to reduce future weed problems.
- B. 120th St., Spruce Grove Twp, Common Tansy Control (Dow AgroSciences Test Site)
- C. 580th Ave, Runeberg Twp, Gravel Pit Certification Program

TOUR 2: Carsonville Town Hall: 1:00-3:00

- A. Road right-of-way treatment, State Hwy 225— Spotted Knapweed control, working with ATV and snowmobile trails.
- B. Spotted Knapweed Biological Control, Brietbach Site, observing Spotted Knapweed seedhead and root weevils in treatment site.
- C. Co Rd 47, Green Valley Township, Section 5, Gravel Pit Certification Program.

Wednesday, July 14

TOUR 1: Callaway Town Hall: 9:30-11:30

- A. Co. Rd 110, USFWS Krueger Site—Thistle Management
- B. Co Rd 109 & Co Rd 153 Intersection, Common Tansy & Wild Parsnip treatment areas, effective herbicides to use.
- C. St. Hwy 224—Gravel Pit Certification Program, Spotted Knapweed Biological Control.

TOUR 2: Lake Eunice Town Hall: 1:00-3:00

- A. Co Rd 11—Wild Parsnip (Dow AgroScience Test Site)
- B. Co Rd 6—Gravel Pit Certification Program, Treatment of Spotted Knapweed.
- C. North Pearl Lake Rd—Wild Parsnip with ongoing control.
- D. 230th Ave—Leafy Spurge Management Program, Biocontrol & Herbicide Treatment
