



Amur Maple

Acer ginnala

- **Plant Characteristics:** A multi-stemmed tall shrub or small tree native to northern Asia. Often has a rounded outline. Outstanding bright reddish fall colors are influenced by soil conditions.
- **Size:** Height: 15–20'
Width: 15–20'
- **Foliage:** Dark green and lustrous above, light green beneath, three-lobed 1 1/2 to 3" long
- **Flower:** Yellowish white, fragrant as the leaves unfurl in April to May.
- **Fruit:** Samara, 3/4–1" long, red to brown and ripens in September–October.
- **Bark:** Grayish brown on older branches.
- **Root:** Fibrous and shallow.
- **Soil:** Adaptable to a variety of soils, except alkaline or poorly-drained soils
- **Tolerances:** More shade tolerant than other maples.
- **USDA Hardiness Zone:** Zone 2
- **Light Range:** Full sun to light shade.
- **pH Range:** 4.5–7.5
- **Pest Resistance:** Relatively free of problems.
- **Water:** Prefers moist, well-drained soils. Moderately drought tolerant..
- **Uses:** Windbreaks, mass plantings, wildlife cover.
- **Other:** Easy to transplant..
