Updated Bivalent Boosters Now Available!

Vaccine Type: Pfizer-BioNTech

People aged 12 and older are now recommended to get an updated bivalent booster dose at least 2 months after their final primary series dose or last booster shot. Either bivalent booster can be used interchangeably.

Appointments Available:

September 30, 2022, 12:00 – 6:00 PM
October 7, 2022, 12:00 – 6:00 PM
Walk-Ins are welcomed, but appointments are recommended.

For All Pfizer Doses: Must be 12 years-old or older

*Parents must give consent for all minors and are required to be present for children ages 5-15.

What you need to sign up for an appointment:

- You need to provide only your first name, last name, date of birth, and home address.
- You are encouraged to provide your mobile phone number and email address, if you have them.
- If you are unable to sign up for an appointment in advance, walk-ins are welcomed.

What you need for your appointment:

- You are required to wear a mask and comply with social distancing requirements.
- You need to confirm your first name, last name, date of birth, and home address.
- You do NOT need to show an ID.
- You do NOT need medical insurance.
- Language interpretation and American Sign Language (ASL) will be available onsite.
- ADA accommodations available onsite.

What is a bivalent booster?

Bivalent vaccines are updated booster vaccines that protect against the original strain of COVID-19 and the Omicron variants currently circulating (BA.4 and BA.5). Updated COVID-19 boosters can both help restore protection that has decreased since previous vaccination and provide broader protection against newer variants. Everyone who is eligible—including those who are moderately or severely immunocompromised—are recommended to receive one dose of the updated vaccine.
